

## Mid-Atlantic Branch Seeks Warehouse

New space is needed to continue operations.

In mid-August we lost our warehouse and vacated the premises resulting in the temporary stoppage of all work. Since we were expecting to sign a new lease this came as a shock without warning!

We are now seeking a new base of operations. We need 5,000-7,000 square feet of space, access to bathrooms and a garage door or loading dock. Our ideal location is Wilmington, DE, but we are also looking in West Chester, PA and other locations in the Delaware Valley. A vacant school, retail shop, grocery store or warehouse are all suitable candidates. Our budget is limited because almost all funds go toward shipping. To date, several properties have been reviewed, but none offer either affordable rates or feasible locations. Do you know of a property for rent, sale or lease, or even available land on which to build? You may hold the answer to our prayers.
