





Persistent Hunger in Malawi

Malawi is grateful for food, but needs more.

Take a look at the three photos above. What do you see? At first glance, the smiling faces tell us all is well; grateful people in need have received food. But look again at the center picture. Do you see the crowd waiting patiently behind the line, wondering when their turn will come? Such is the scene that greeted members of *Action for Progress* during the distribution of food to people suffering from malnutrition and hunger in Kayembe Village. The intended recipients of our March container were to be orphans, widows, elderly, and those with mobility challenges, but there was confusion and other villagers



came as well. While many received KAH meals, others were turned away with promises of food for the following week.

Poignant stories of children came back to us from the event. Edita Banda (left), lost both parents and now depends on her extended family. She clutches her meals desperately, having already experienced the pain of hunger and fear of the future.

Anxiety in the village is due to devastation from a trio of 2022 spring storms that wreaked havoc in the area and caused weather-related crop failures. Currently, an estimated 2 million Africans are critically short of food. The situation is so bad that many aid organizations are focusing their attention on eastern Africa. In 2022, five

MAB experiences a surge in growth.

Every January, we publish figures from the previous year at the bottom of pages 2 and 3. While overall numbers have been steadily increasing, a few are particularly noteworthy. In the last year, our supporters increased an incredible 89%, bicycles shipped increased 60%, and volunteer hours went up 10%. Best of all, we can no longer count our volunteers because so many of you toil outside the walls of our warehouse! We thank the Lord for these blessings and more, serving him by serving our neighbor. Into this critical situation MAB shipped our second container on October 5, 2022. Twenty-seven volunteers came to help, including scouts and their parents from Troop 62 in Kemblesville, PA. They used a bucket brigade (below) to load the over 200 unboxed medical aids, children's items and bicycles, along with 990 boxes of clothing, bedding, toys, and 61,912 KAH meals.



Ten weeks later, we received good news – the container arrived and was unloaded. Bishop Chabinga quickly sent back pictures to inform us. He shared his gratitude for all

OGT shipments with the Norfolk office, "I for one I am very thankful unto God...I am very honored that OGT, President Wilke would consider Malawi. Your choice to start sending containers to Malawi was a God driven choice. May God continually be blessing OGT."

Last spring, MAB was introduced to a wonderful group of Leo Club students from the Avon Grove Charter School in PA when they donated 1,000 stuffed animals. Two months later thirteen kids came to the warehouse to prepare and box an impressive 321 Hygiene Kits.

On November 9th, we welcomed 48 LEO teens who joined our regular volunteers to pack a portion of the huge donation of women's clothing (see "Donations Bonanza" article, pg. 2). They filled 200 boxes in less than three hours! Once again, we observed the Leo



Club's joyous attitude as they exemplified their motto of Leadership Experience Opportunity. Everyone enjoyed working together in service to those in need. ■

Ukrainian Relief Update

Here is the latest on OGT aid to war refugees.

OGT, Inc. continues to send relief shipments for refugees in Ukraine, Moldovia and Romania. They delivered, or have enroute, eleven cargo plane loads and five shipping containers to these



destinations. Additionally, as many as fifteen OGT branch shipments to Latvia and Lithuania are being shared with refugees sheltering within their borders. Besides shipments of critically needed food and aid, another campaign is underway to provide lights to the millions of war victims living without electricity. The Maryland Branch spearheaded a nationwide 'Light Up Ukraine' drive raising enough money to purchase 4,870 battery-powered Luci Lights, 200 of which our Mid-Atlantic Branch contributed. Please pray for this war to end and relief to come for the millions who are suffering.
