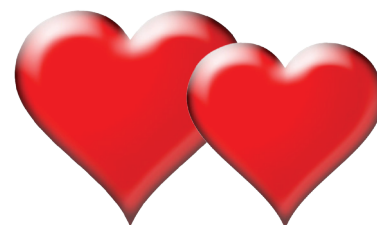
What made you interested in OGT?

BEARING HOPE IN UKRAINE. SEEING THE IMPACT, FIRST-HAND

In the fall of 2025, Orphan Grain Train North Dakota volunteers Kirk and Brian Rosin, travelled to Ukraine to support ongoing humanitarian and ministry efforts during a time of great need. Their three-week journey focused on strengthening existing programs and identifying new opportunities to serve vulnerable children and young adults.

After flying into Warsaw, Poland, Kirk and Brian travelled by bus into Ukraine, staying in Lutsk, Zhytomyr, and Kyiv while visiting orphanages and care facilities in nearby communities. A primary focus of the trip was evaluating and expanding Orphan Grain Train's Adopt-an-Orphanage program.

Through this program, Orphan Grain Train partners with orphanages that demonstrate transparency, clear need, and openness to sharing the Gospel. Kirk witnessed firsthand how donor support has made a difference—providing refrigerators for medicine and food, wood for heat, cooking equipment, furniture, and building materials. In one facility, supplies helped create safe housing for boys with severe disabilities who previously had nowhere to stay.

“The gratitude from the directors was overwhelming,” Kirk shared. “They are facing challenges most of us can hardly imagine, and the support they’ve received has been life-changing.”

During the trip, Kirk and Brian identified 10 additional orphanages that meet Orphan Grain Train's partnership guidelines and could benefit from future support.

They also explored opportunities to establish a Hannah House-type program in Ukraine. Hannah House serves young adults aging out of orphanages by providing housing and teaching essential life skills such as cooking, cleaning, and finding employment. Potential locations in Lutsk and Kyiv were identified, though ongoing power outages and war-related challenges have slowed progress.

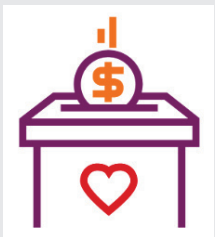
