Second Shipment of 2025 to Appalachia

OGT Team - I have the absolute honor and privilege to let you know that this morning (August 28th) we loaded a shipment to Hazel Green Food Project (HGFP), Hazel Green, Kentucky for the second time this calendar year. As a reminder, HGFP sits in one of the poorest counties in all of Appalachia. We loaded winter clothes for men, women, and children, plus-sized clothes, linens, beds and mattresses, durable medical equipment, medical supplies, school supplies, toys, tools, bicycles, a gasoline generator, hospital-grade PT equipment, and more! This totaled 918 pieces and weighed 18,027 lbs. Our partners in Hazel Green report that they eagerly await the shipment to arrive tomorrow, Friday.

Each one of us at OGT Maryland Branch is a very unique part of a greater common body which has been called to one mission: to serve the less fortunate of our world while extolling the Goodness of God! As such, no single personal contribution gets a shipment to its destination; rather when we all work together for the Glory of God, as scripture edifies, our work and mission thrive!!! That said, this absolutely includes our partners at OGT Headquarters and our transportation partners in New Jersey! May the Lord bless each one of you for your enduring dedication.

More Humanitarian Aid Headed to Ghana

Last week we completed the final installment of goods and transfer to the Ebenezer Akwanga Human Rights Institute, Clinton, MD in this calendar year. We delivered about ~3,500 lbs of clothing, beds, medical durable goods, school supplies, and sewing machines and supplies to compliment a load we delivered in July for a combined total of ~7,000lbs of aid to the people of Ghana. Our loads, along with other collected goods will be transferred into a container and shipped next week to Accra, Ghana. In a couple of months, our constituent, Dr. Ebenezer Akwanga, will

meet the container to clear customs and begin the distribution process across hundreds of towns and miles. Dr. Akwanga has expressed his most sincere thanks for our Branch's continued support of his mission and ministry to care for the people of Ghana including multiple Christian and Muslim communities in need. May the Lord continue to bless us with the volunteers, material goods, and the drive we need to fulfill His Will - as it is in Heaven!!!! As we know, it indeed takes a village - The Maryland Branch - to make is all happen.
