CRISIS IN UKRAINE THE WAR CONTINUES

This year on February 24th, Russia invaded the Ukraine causing a refugee crisis that is hard to fathom. Millions have fled their country; many are displaced; and many because of health, age, and various other reasons have had to stay in place, bunkering down in their basements, bomb shelters, and/or just trying to find a safe haven. Tens of thousands have been either killed or hurt. So much destruction, sadness and heartache.

The Orphan Grain Train has been trying to help since the very start. Wisconsin had sent a container to the Ukraine in November that arrived at the port the week the war started. This particular container just happened to be filled from front to back with medical items for Smolin Ministries. God was way ahead of the war and was providing before the war had even started!! The port was bombed and closed soon after the container arrived. After many prayers and figuring out logistics, they found out the container survived and were able to pick it up. After which they immediately shared the contents with hospitals and families in desperate need. We thank God for His protection of this container and the contents



within!! OGT has been sending containers and air shipments to the Ukraine and neighboring countries of Ukraine who are all helping to manage the refugee crisis. Wisconsin's airflight was filled with hygiene, medical, blankets, baby formula, diapers, major medical, boots, new underwear and socks, food, and so much more. Two sea containers are planned and ready, one hopefully will be leaving Wisconsin by August 10th with another to follow soon after. Wisconsin also sent a container to Latvia, some of which was used to help refugees in need there. I can't say it enough, but thank you to our generous OGT family and friends for helping us to make these loads happen!!

There have been so many delays and cancellations. Please continue to pray that God will clear the way for more needed supplies to get into the Ukraine without delay and for the funding to ship and buy the extra necessary items. We want to thank our generous donors, volunteers, and supporters that have given and worked so hard to make these precious relief shipments possible!! We have been filled with awe and brought to tears by the love and generous support from so many around our state and country! We could not do what we do without you!! Please continue to pray for the people of Ukraine and the relief workers there; for God's protection, strength, and encouragement in the face of such pain and suffering; and for His mercy, grace and presence to surround them all.

We will continue to keep you updated on the current needs and prayer requests as we get them from Vitaliy and his team in the Ukraine. Right now, we are currently collecting the following items for Ukraine: new socks and underwear for all ages, long underwear for all ages, baby diapers, adult incontinence, hygiene items (from the OGT hygiene kit list only), blankets (new or lightly used), winter coats and boots for all ages, and winter gloves, mittens and hats for all ages. Our mission leader Vitaliy has shared that winter is going to be unbearably hard for those left in Ukraine's wartorn areas, for they will have no electricity. These items will help immensely. Thank you again for all the support you have given!! We have an amazing OGT family, and we are so glad you are part of it!!! We thank the Lord for each one of you!!

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTORS "HOW DO GODS LIVE?"

Graciously, of course; especially in this hurting world.

Grace, mercy and peace to you through Jesus Christ. AMEN

In John 10 Jesus quoted Psalm 82 as part of our Law, God's Law. It has the authority of Scripture which cannot be broken! Jesus came to authenticate it; to make it true and prove it to be true.

We might not always think about the Psalms that way so it is a good thing Jesus spoke this way and made it so clear for us.

Psalm 10:34-36 says, "Is it not written in your Law, 'I said, you are gods'? If He called them gods to whom the word of God came—and Scripture cannot be broken— do you say of Him Whom the Father consecrated and sent into the world, 'You are blaspheming,' because I said, 'I am the Son of God'?"

Our God came as the Man, Jesus Christ, to be the fulfillment of the Law for us. He is the One Who completes the Law for mankind. And He tells us what it means.

Jesus tells the people who were ready to kill Him that it is right to say what the Bible says; "You are all gods." So they should not try to kill Jesus when Jesus says, "I am the Son of God," or "I and the Father are one."

Later, in John 17, Jesus prays to our Father in heaven for us all to be one with God in the same way that Jesus is one with the Father. When we are Baptized in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we are baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus and we are 'children of God'! Together with Jesus. "You are all gods."

God created mankind to be with Him forever! Praise be to God, He makes that possible even though we have fallen into sin. God is so gracious that He gives us a new life in Jesus even though our first life has been ruined by our sin.

Psalm 82:6-7 says, "I said, 'You are gods, sons of the Most High, all of you; nevertheless, like men you shall die, and fall like any prince." Now Jesus tells us we will also be raised from the dead by the grace of God through faith in

Jesus. That is the very reason Jesus came to be one of us human beings.

Some people are still not understanding God's Holy Scripture. Some still want to kill those who say they are gods. They don't want us to claim that we are children of God. Christians are persecuted and even killed today in many places around the world. We may face more and more persecution for being Christians. Don't let that get in the way of being God's person, a friend of God, a servant of God, like our Savior, Jesus, Who served our God by setting His glory aside and becoming the atoning sacrifice that takes our sin away. We are one with our suffering Savior. That is part of being gods.

How do gods live? We live by grace. God is gracious enough to give us life even though we die, He is gracious enough to die in our place so that we can be forgiven of all our sin. He makes us gods even though we die, and we act like gods when we are gracious like our God

In another place Jesus says, "Be perfect as your Father in heaven is perfect." (Matthew 5:48) and "If you would be perfect...come follow Me." (19:21)

We need to be perfect and Jesus makes us perfect through His sacrifice. Now our lives are a sacrifice to God because He has shown us that grace is the way to live as gods. In God we are perfectly gracious even unto death (we forgive as we have been forgiven). Then, because Jesus has risen from the dead, we will, also, and we will continue being gods with God forever.

Following Jesus means suffering with Jesus as we show His grace to those around us.

We thank God for the opportunities OGT gives us to tackle some of the suffering of this world as His servants and we tackle it graciously (and as gracefully as possible).
