DEVOTIONAL THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTORS "THE SAME: YESTERDAY, TODAY, AND FOREVER"

Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, and today, and forever.

-Hebrews 13:8

There have been many different attempts to paint Jesus Christ down through the centuries. Perhaps one of the most famous is Leonardo Di Vinci's painting of the Lord's Supper. In this masterpiece, Di Vinci brings the changeless Christ into a contemporary setting. He brings Christ into his own time period, the 15th century by using, cups, ordinary eating utensils and furniture of his day in the scene.

The message we can draw from this is that while time passes, while household items we live with change, while the world changes, one thing remains, one thing stays the same, one thing we can count on, Jesus Christ. He is the same, yesterday, today, and forever! That's a promise you can count on from God's unchanging Word!

Luther's small catechism teaches us what a changeless Christ means. When Luther asks the question "Who is God?" in the section of the first article of the Apostles Creed, he points out that the Father, in addition to being all powerful, all knowing, and all present; is unchangeable or immutable. James 1:17 says, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows."

When talking about Jesus Christ in the second article, Luther asks, "How do you know that Jesus Christ is true God?" One reason is that Scripture teaches He possesses divine attributes, which are qualities or characteristics that could only be true of God; and one of those qualities is that Jesus is unchangeable, as Heb.13:8 spells out, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." What does this means that Jesus Christ is the same? His love for you and me is unchangeable! That's good news in a world that can be an unstable place of uncertainty and change. Think of all the changes that happen around us, from seasons changing, to Monarchy changes, to job changes, to changes in family dynamics. Change is inevitable. We aren't always happy with change, because it often catches us off guard and can be painful. That's why it's been said that only babies like change.

Even though change seems to be happening at an accelerating rate in our world, we do not lose heart because God is sovereign, He is in control. He is never caught off guard by changes that occur. That's comforting as we see the epic struggle between darkness and light continue to be played out before our eyes daily. The threat of terrorism at home and abroad, violence, war in Ukraine, fires, floods, earth quakes, hurricanes, drought, and uncertain world economics, remind us that we live in a changed and changing world. Yet Christ and His gracious forgiveness and love for us do not change.

People need to hear this message, and as believers in Christ it is our duty to tell the world that only the Good News of the Gospel, of Christ's death and resurrection for us sinners, has the power to change people's lives and give them hope. So, while we live in an ever changing world; we can be encouraged knowing that our changeless Lord has the power to change the world!

Part of the Orphan Grain Train mission statement reads, "To share personal and material resources in bringing Christ's name and character to needy people both far and near." Through our efforts we can make a difference in this dark world as we let our light shine for Jesus. May God bless our work for His glory to give hope to the less fortunate, so that by His grace and mercy, their lives can be changed for time and eternity by our changeless Savior.
