WHAT INTRIGUED YOU TO VOLUNTEER AT OGT:

CHALLENGES:

Our challenges are happy ones— "problems good to have." We thought we had ample warehouse space. But we still haven't learned to keep from spilling over with certain items or how to navigate efficiently. We have needed a large crew to pass boxes one-by-one through a single door to fill a container. That was "fun" for previous shipments, but recently we were gifted with a large new utility door. Bravo! Communicating with constituents is also an opportune challenge sparking new avenues through video and other "marketing" possibilities for telling the story of branch efforts.

FAVORITE SHIPMENTS:

The Michigan Branch has been thrilled to send shipments to Kyrgyzstan, Panama, Moldova and Georgia. However, the recent response to needs of Ukrainian refugees gave overwhelming joy and satisfaction. Within a two-week interval this March an outpouring from individuals, churches, and the community enabled the Michigan branch to send a full semi-trailer filled with relief supplies to Norfolk. Donors also opened hearts and hands to make possible a gift to Norfolk of over \$42,000. The scale of this effort has set a new benchmark for service in the future.

SOMETHING UNIQUE ABOUT YOUR BRANCH:

Unquestionably our most loveable volunteer is a sweet ten-year-old dog named Lacy. She never misses a work day at Orphan Grain Train—Michigan.
