
'Oktoberfest in May' Norfolk Area Big Give Tuesday, May 24

Weekly Devotion

Brothers, children of Abraham, & you God-fearing Gentiles, it is to us that this message of salvation has been sent. The people of Jerusalem & their rulers did not recognize Jesus, yet in condemning Him they fulfilled the words of the prophets that are read every Sabbath. Though they found no proper ground for a death sentence, they asked Pilate to have Him executed. When they had carried out all that was written about Him, they took Him down from the tree & laid Him in a tomb. But God raised Him from the dead, & for many days He was seen by those who had traveled with Him from Galilee to Jerusalem. They are now His witnesses to our people. We tell you the good news: What God promised our fathers, He has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus. (Acts 13:26-32a)

Encouragement: Paul & his companions are invited to speak "a message of encouragement for the people" in the synagogue in Pisidian Antioch. (Acts 13:15b) Paul takes full advantage of this opportunity, although it may not seem at first like words of encouragement. He rightfully notes that the "people of Jerusalem & their rulers did not recognize Jesus." Instead, they persuaded Pilate to condemn Him to the cross.

Jesus died on that cross, but things didn't end there. God raised Him from the dead on the third day, "And for many days He was seen by those who had traveled with Him from Galilee to Jerusalem." There were many eyewitness accounts of the resurrected Jesus.

Paul told them the good news. "What God promised our fathers He has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus." The evil plots of man came to naught. Jesus died to save us from our sins. He rose in triumph over sin, death, & Satan.

Today's Prayer: "Amen! Praise & glory & wisdom & thanks & honor & power & strength be to our God for ever & ever. Amen!" (Rev. 7:12)
