"On May 4 we visited the Kyiv region Visited Irpen, Buchi, Gostomel, Nemishayevomu, Borodianci and Vorzelí. Being there, mixed feelings occur. Death and at the same moment the feeling of life begins to return there. The stories of people who have lost everything, their worries and pain will not leave anyone indifferent.

More people are coming home every day.

Our churches are actively serving there now, as they undertook a major volunteer strike to help people today. One of the churches that we have attended gives out food to people everyday. They help more than 200 people per day. Our help to these regions now is to provide people with food and building materials (at least film to start so they

can tape windows) because the destruction we have seen is just awful. What the "Russian world" did for a month we will have to rebuild for years.

Victory in this war will be the beginning of rebuilding for us. It's a lot of work to do, it takes strength, patience, and most importantly resources and people to restore everything that has been destroyed. Moving forward with God's help and support of the whole world."





Widows of War Served

Social Charity Fund “Compassion” in Kyrgyzstan was able to share quilts, coats, winter accessories, clothing, shoes, medical equipment and bicycles with many families living in poverty, the homeless and with widows from war. Weekly Devotion

As Saul neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground & heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?" "Who are You, Lord?" Saul asked. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," He replied. "Now get up & go into the city, & you will be told what you must do." . . . Then Ananias went to the house & entered it. Placing his hands on Saul, he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again & be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, & he could see again. He got up & was baptized, & after taking some food, he regained his strength. (Acts. 9:3-5, 17-18)

Saul's Conversion: Let me refresh your memory. Saul is on his way from Jerusalem to Damascus. He has been granted the authority to arrest Christians. Saul despises Christians. Remember, he was present at Stephen's stoning. An astounding & unprecedented thing happens. Saul is knocked from his horse & a voice speaks to him. "*Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?*" When Saul asks who this is, the reply is, "*I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting.*" Saul's blood must have run cold.

More amazing things follow. Saul is blinded. He is led to a house where he remains secluded for three days. Ananias, probably reluctantly, is sent by the Lord to heal Saul & baptize him. Saul will be called to be the great evangelist to the Gentiles & the author of almost half of the New Testament. Truly amazing!

Today's Prayer: Dear Jesus, we praise You for calling Saul to be Your servant. Call us to carry out Your kingdom work. Amen.
