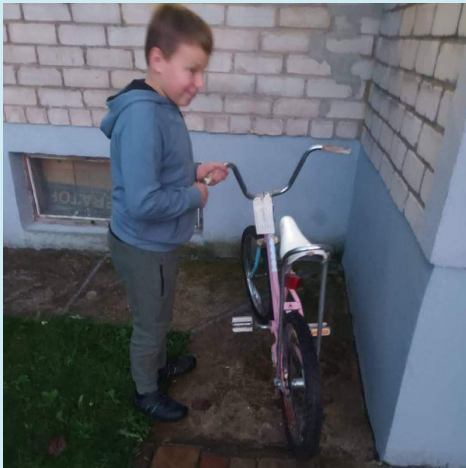
### *Many Families Served*
