Orphan Grain Train is powered by volunteers and Pastor Elliott Robertson is a reason for our success. Pastor Elliott has served on our OGT Board for the past five years. In addition to serving as a chaplain and secretary at our Board meetings, he has served as a liason to the needy in Baltimore City. OGT helps hundreds of families annually by providing coats and warm winter clothing, mostly through the churches. We've also distributed thousands of Bombas



socks to the homeless across the city. Pastor Elliott is instrumental in making all of this happen!

After a happy and rewarding twenty-five year pastorate at the 105+ year-old Martini Lutheran Church in Baltimore, Pastor Elliott recently retired. "The congregation was great to allow me to spend time with three ministry loves: The Wyneken Project, Orphan Grain Train, and Lutherans for Life. In retirement, through the Wyneken Project, I'm continuing my love of city ministry - where so many are in survival mode - which is intense and joyful and time-consuming if you want to be at all effective. Comparatively, Orphan Grain Train is my ministry 'drive in the country' where things are more relaxed. OGT is a beehive of blessing, a place of community and service, and of those who want to be stewards of God's material and spiritual blessings with worldwide effect."

In his retirement, Pastor Elliott is able to find more time to listen to live bluegrass, watch race cars "go fast and turn left", and hopefully use his lifetime National Park Pass to see more of the American West! He continues to pursue theology, "which rightly done, is to draw closer to Jesus Christ and His cross, challenging the mind and apprehending the treasures God has placed throughout His written word. OGT Maryland is so blessed to have Pastor Elliott with us, and we wish him a long and fruitful retirement!

After breakfast, Bruce spoke about OGT and its mission, Elfie spoke about Luci Lights, and Norm took them on a tour of the warehouse. AID TO TURKEY

On February 6th, Turkey was hit with an earthquake of massive proportion, affecting over 13.5 million people. As of February 20th, 41,020 deaths were reported, thousands of others are missing, millions are homeless. Immediately after the disaster was reported, a local Millersville resident from Turkey posted an appeal for help on social media. Linda Zahn, a long-time OGT volunteer responded. OGT was able to provide immediate assistance with a donation of winter clothing and coats for men, women, and children and several boxes of blankets. In addition, Judy White and her quilting group from the Annapolis Evangelical Lutheran Church donated 31 quilts. The items were picked up at the warehouse on a Friday. They were scheduled to be on site in Turkey and ready for distribution on the following Monday. Thanks to Linda and Judy for the crucial part they played in providing immediate disaster relief to the people in Turkey.

A VERY GENEROUS DONATION

OGT Maryland has been blessed! An anonymous donor has recently given us a truck. This generous donation will enable us to do larger pick-ups and dropoffs whenever the need arises. We will no longer need to rent a truck when transporting donations out of



state, e.g., to the Christian Appalachian Project in Kentucky. The truck has already been used to transport goods to Pennsylvania and Delaware for further shipment to Malawi and Ukraine. This very generous donation is greatly appreciated!

TEAMING UP WITH THE MID-ATLANTIC BRANCH

In early February, Bruce and Martha went on a road trip in our new truck! They delivered 17 sewing machines (some old, some new) to the Mid-Atlantic branch near Philadelphia. These machines, along with a sewing curriculum prepared by Judy White, will be shipped to Malawi, so that they can set up a sewing school in their country similar to the sewing schools that OGT Maryland has already established in Cameroon, South Sudan and Liberia.

Bruce and Martha then headed to a warehouse in Delaware where they dropped off over 2,900 Luci Lights and 162 boxes of winter clothing from our branch, as well as a pallet of winter clothing and multiple boxes of toys that were given to them by the Mid-Atlantic branch when they dropped off the sewing machines. These items will be airlifted and/or shipped to Ukraine in partnership with St. Andrews Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral in Silver Spring.

MORE AID REQUESTED FOR UKRANIAN SOLDIERS

A new list of needed supplies for wounded soldiers in Ukraine has recently been shared with us by our partner church, St. Andrew Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral. The following items have been requested:

- Men's new underwear
- New and gently used t-shirts and long-sleeved t-shirts
- Rain Ponchos (sturdy type, not disposable)
- Protein bars
- Gauze and bandages
- Pain killers
- Allergy medicine
- Multivitamins
- Water purifying tablets
- Burn gel
- Blood stoppers

Items may be dropped off at the warehouse on Tuesdays from 9:00 to noon and 5:00-7:00 p.m. or on the second Saturday of the month from 9:00 to noon. Please be sure that all medical items are unopened and are not already expired. Mark all donations for Ukraine. Any and all donations will be greatly appreciated!

'LIGHT UP UKRAINE' CAMPAIGN A Huge Success

Our "Light Up Ukraine" Campaign has officially come to a close. Through the overwhelming generosity of OGT supporters, we collected a total of \$92,798.38, enabling us to purchase 11,759 Luci Lights to benefit the people of Ukraine. These lights were transported via airfreight to either Moldova or Poland and trucked to Kiev where they were received by a Ukrainian Bishop who is a friend of our partner



church in Silver Spring, St. Andrew Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral. He has 6,000 churches under his parsonage. Many thanks to each and every one of you who participated in our campaign. Along with our prayers, these lights are intended to bring LIGHT and HOPE to the Ukrainian people.
