Weekly Devotion

When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "What if Joseph holds a grudge against us & pays us back for all the wrongs we did to him?" So they sent word to Joseph, saying, "Your father left these instructions before he died: This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to forgive your brothers the sins & wrongs they committed in treating you so badly. Now please forgive the sins of the servants of the God of your father.' When their message came to him, Joseph wept. His brothers then came & threw themselves down before him. "We are your slaves," they said. But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you & your children." And he reassured them & spoke kindly to them. (Gen. 50:15-21)

Joseph: Joseph's story spans *Genesis Chapters 37-50*. No one else in *Genesis* receives this much attention. Let me refresh your memory. Joseph's brothers sell him into slavery, then convince their father that Joseph was killed by wild animals. His master Potiphar's wife falsely accuses Joseph, & Potiphar has Joseph thrown into prison. Because Joseph can interpret dreams, eventually Pharaoh summons him. He explains Pharaoh's dreams to him. Pharaoh elevates him to second in authority over all of Egypt. Because of Joseph's wisdom, Egyptians are spared from famine. Jacob's sons—Joseph's brothers—travel to Egypt to buy grain. Joseph reveals himself to them. Then he brings his father Jacob & his entire family to Egypt. They are settled in the most fertile land of Goshen.

Joseph's brothers have every right to fear him. If anyone was ever entitled to vengeance, it was Joseph. They even concoct a story that had their dead father pleading on their behalf. They throw themselves on Joseph's mercy & offer to become his slaves.

Joseph forgives. "Am I in the place of God?" he says. Furthermore, he says, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives." This included the lives of his own family. Not only does Joseph reassure them that they have nothing to fear from him, he also says, "I will provide for you & your children." God uses the tragedy of Joseph's circumstances to be a blessing that goes far beyond the people of Egypt.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help us take to heart St. Paul's words in Rom. 8:28: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." And we echo the words of Ps. 103:1. "Bless the Lord, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name." Amen.
