Weekly Devotion

"Here is My servant, whom I uphold, My chosen one in whom I delight; I will put My Spirit on Him & He will bring justice to the nations. He will not shout or cry out, or raise His voice in the street. A bruised reed He will not break, & a smoldering wick He will not snuff out. In faithfulness He will bring forth justice; He will not falter or be discouraged till He establishes justice on the earth. In His law the islands will put their hope." This is what God the Lord says—He who created the heavens &

stretched them out, who spread out the earth & all that comes out of it, who gives breath to its people, & life to those who walk on it: "I, the Lord, have called You in righteousness; I will take hold of Your hand. I will keep You & will make You to be a covenant for the people & a light to the Gentiles, to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison & to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness." (Is. 42:1-7)

A God Who Speaks Softly: There were many reasons why the Jews of the 1st century A.D. wouldn't accept Jesus as the Messiah. Mainly, they expected a Messiah who would come in power & might to vanquish the Romans & restore Israel to prominence among the nations. This would require a Messiah who would shout in victory over His foes.

Instead, they got a Messiah who "(would) not shout or cry out." They got a Messiah who would not "raise His voice in the street." And this Messiah's idea of "justice" would not coincide with the people's idea of justice. His idea of "justice" would be to offer Himself as a sacrifice for the sins of all people, & that included the Gentiles. We still have a Savior today who comes to us gently. "A bruised reed He will not break, & a smoldering wick He will not snuff out." His faithfulness in the face of our faithlessness establishes Himself as our humble Lord & Savior.

Prayer Prompts: Give thanks & praise to Jesus, because He is the humble Savior of the world.
