Weekly Devotion

To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in His steps. "He committed no sin, & no deceit was found in His mouth." When they hurled their insults at Him, He did not retaliate; when He suffered, He made no threats. Instead, He entrusted Himself to Him who judges justly. He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, so that we might die to sins & live for righteousness; by His wounds you have been healed. For you were like sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the Shepherd & Overseer of your souls. (1 Peter 2:21-25)

Retaliation: When I was in high school, one day in Algebra a classmate kept poking me. Finally, I had enough, turned around, & told him to knock it off. Guess who got in trouble? That would be me, because I was reprimanded for talking in class. When we got outside, I confronted him & punched him in the neck. Unfortunately, our Algebra teacher was right behind us. Not my best moment. Retaliation is our natural reaction when someone wrongs us. Retaliation seems to make sense when we are hurt. Jesus, as He hung on the cross,

dying a tortuous death, "did not retaliate." "He made no threats." By human standards this is unthinkable. By God's standards, it made perfect sense. Jesus loved the world so much that He was willing to die on the cross to deliver us from our sins. And He left us an example, "that (we) should follow in His steps." The Holy & Resurrected Son of God, who had every right to retaliate against those whose sins nailed Him to the cross, makes it possible for to love others, even those who He loves wrong US, even as us. Prayer Prompts: Ask God to help you to love others, even when they hurt you.
