Weekly Devotion

Let the peace of God rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. Let the word of God dwell in you richly as you teach & admonish one another with all wisdom, & as you sing psalms, hymns, & spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him. (Col. 3:15-17)

Admonish: St. Paul calls us to “teach & admonish one another.” Dictionary.com defines “admonish” as follows: “to caution, advise, or counsel against something; to reprove or scold, especially in a mild & good-willed manner; to urge to a duty, remind.” We don’t like to be admonished, even when we deserve it. If you’re a parent, I’ll bet that on more than one occasion you admonished one of your children. I’ll bet they didn’t like it, & you may have found it hard to scold them, even though you knew that it was for their own good. It’s not necessarily in our nature to “admonish” others. Either we avoid confrontation, even when faced with ungodly behavior within the Body of Christ, or we scold harshly. Yet the Lord calls us to “admonish.” The Lord admonishes us through the Law or through our conscience, & we may not appreciate it at the time, even though it’s for our own good. How are we to admonish?

“Bear with each other & forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put

on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.” (Col. 3:13-14) We certainly deserve to be admonished severely, but the Lord admonishes us with a gentle hand, directing us toward repentance, because He seeks to save us.

Prayer Prompts: Ask God to accept His admonishment as a blessing. Ask Him to help you admonish your Christian brothers & sisters, as needed, & in a godly manner.
