A "refuge," according to dictionary.com, is "a shelter or protection from danger, trouble; a place of shelter, protection, or safety; anything to which one has recourse for aid, relief, or escape." It's easy to see why wildlife refuges have been set aside to protect wild fowl from being hunted to extinction.
