I am the true vine, and My Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in Me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in Me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in Me . . . This is to My Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be My disciples. (John 15:1-4)

Branches & Fruit: When I was growing up in Concordia, MO, our next-door neighbor, Mrs. Lange—who was also my 2nd grade teacher—had a number of fruit trees. Our favorite was her green apple tree. It was perfect for climbing, and we would help ourselves to the delicious albeit sour fruit. One year she asked me to cut down a branch from the tree, because it was no longer producing apples. I should have been more careful, because I cut down the wrong branch, but I digress.

Those who grow fruit understand an important principle. If a

branch or vine is not producing fruit, it needs to be pruned. Otherwise, it is draining the plant of vital resources that are needed to continue bearing fruit. Jesus uses figurative language in the Gospel of John to compare our relationship with God the Father to the relationship a gardener shares with his or her fruit trees. Branches that do not bear fruit must be pruned, so that the plant will be even more fruitful. This pruning in our lives may take many forms. We may be pruned as we devote ourselves to Word and Sacrament. We may be pruned through the trials He sends us, so that we turn to Him in prayer. And we may be pruned as we sacrificially serve others. As we “remain in the vine,” the Father’s “vine,” we bear “fruit,” not by our own efforts but by the grace of God. That includes the “fruit” of faith, and it includes the “fruit” of good works, perhaps especially the “fruit” of “love.”

St. John also writes in his 1st Epistle, “And this is His command: to believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as He commanded us. Those who obey His commands live in Him, and He in them. And this is how we know that He lives in us: We know it by the Spirit He gave us.” (1 John 3:23-24)

Father, prune us, so that we may bear much fruit. We ask this in Your Son’s name. Amen.
