OGT-Maryland and OGT-New England Share Medical Equipment

In late May, both Orphan Grain Train-Maryland and Orphan Grain Train-New England shared a great deal of medical equipment to people in their communities. Many shower chairs, commodes, walkers and wheelchairs have been picked up at these locations by individuals who are in need either from failing health, recent surgery or change in abilities. OGT-Maryland gave out over 53 medical items and OGT-New England over 125. Thank you, to all the volunteers who clean, prepare, fix and share these items that are so needed by so many.

OGT-Ohio Transports Items to Kentucky, Indiana and Ohio

Orphan Grain Train Ohio was busy again at transporting needed items to groups in Kentucky, Indiana and Ohio. In May, Appalachia Reach Out in Inez, Kentucky received over ninety pieces of furniture, sixty boxes and individual household items, toys, clothing and hygiene supplies. Two days later, OGT Ohio traveled to The Attic in McKee, Kentucky delivering clothing and household items. They traveled on to Concordia Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana to bring 25 boxes of clothing to seminarians and their families. OGT-Missouri-Illinois Share Food with Pantries

Weekly Devotion

"To you I call, O Lord my Rock: do not turn a deaf ear to me. For if You remain silent, I will be like those who have gone down to the pit. Hear my cry for mercy as I call to You for help, as I lift up my hands toward Your Most Holy Place." Amen. (Ps. 28:1-2) And the teachers of the law who came down from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebub! By the prince of demons He is driving out demons." So Jesus called them and spoke to them in parables: "How can Satan drive out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. And if Satan opposes himself and is divided, he cannot stand; his end has come." (Mark 3:22-26)

Beelzebub: In William Goldings's classic novel, "Lord of the Flies," he writes about a group of boys who are stranded on an island after their plane crashes. In the absence of any adults, they develop their own means of survival and work together. At first everything goes well, but eventually evil has its way with them and things begin to degenerate. They turn against each other and even kill some of their own. If it wasn't for their timely rescue, it's possible that they all would have destroyed one another. "Beelzebub" means "Lord of the Flies." It's an apt description. Even as flies congregate over decaying flesh, Satan hovers over humankind, because we suffer from the decay of sin and death. He relishes our decay. The teachers of the law commit a grave offense against Jesus when they accuse Him of being "possessed by Beelzebub" and for "driving out demons" "by the prince of demons." Jesus easily refutes their accusations and warns them of the eternal consequences for those who reject Him. We are constantly threatened by Satan. He is the most powerful of demons, and we understandably fear him-or at least we should. Praise God-Jesus has defeated Satan! Already in the Garden of Eden, after Satan in the form of a serpent deceived Adam and Eve, which brought about a curse on all humankind, God speaks His first Gospel promise in the Bible: "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; He will crush your head, and you will

strike His heel." (Gen. 3:15) That offspring was Jesus-the Messiah, our Lord and Savior over sin, death, and Satan.

Thank You, dearest Jesus, that You have promised to protect us by the power of Your name. Sanctify us by the truth, for Your Word is the truth. Bless us in our efforts to accomplish Your mission and ministry in a world that hates You and hates us. Amen.
