Orphan Grain Train - Phoenix







On July 18th, Orphan Grain Train Phoenix loaded 640 boxes of men's, women's and children's clothing, shoes, bedding, quilts, toys, layette kits, six bikes, folding chairs and more, onto a 26' box truck and drove over five hours to deliver to a new location on the Navajo Nation located in Klagetoh, AZ. They were welcomed with smiles and hugs and many residents helped unload the shipment. Half-way through the unloading of the truck, several of the women residents made fresh Navajo Fry Bread Tacos. It was just what was needed to have the energy to finish unloading the truck. A week later, it was reported that all the items were distributed to the surrounding area and the local churches. OGT-Phoenix was asked when they will come again!

OGT-New England Sends Load to Support CAP and Texas Relief



Orphan Grain Train New England sent out a great load on Thursday for Christian Appalachian Project to help with their response efforts in the midsection of the country. The 53' trailer arrived ahead of schedule. but thankfully, the hard-working crew of volunteers completed the load in just about 2 hours. Pastor Dick Dill provided close to 40,000 Harvest Pack meals and a local manufacturer supplied 5 pallets of shampoo and bodywash. Lots of medical, clothing, and household items were included in the 26 pallets that filled the trailer. CAP has been helping with the Texas floods and just sent a shipment there on July 15. We are grateful we can support CAP in their Texas relief efforts and grateful to all the people who orchestrated this load. Thank you, New England volunteers for your enthusiasm and energy you put into packing this load and getting it on the road to its destination.

Heinz Bruno Piehl went home to be with our Lord on July 7, 2025. He passed peacefully at home in Berthoud, Colorado. In the fall of 2000, Heinz and Carol, members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Julesburg, Colorado, attended an annual meeting of Orphan Grain Train in Norfolk, Nebraska. They

returned home with an eager desire to collect clothes in Julesburg for this world-wide mission. With their persistent spirit, they immediately began speaking at area churches and spreading the news of Orphan Grain Train and the idea of creating an Orphan Grain Train branch within the State of Colorado. In November 2001, they and their many excited volunteers, began collecting clothes in a retired John Deere Dealership warehouse building in Julesburg. Today, Orphan Grain Train-Rocky Mountain Branch is located in a new facility, built and dedicated in the fall of 2007. We are so grateful for the life of Heinz Bruno Piehl and for the passion he had for the work of Christ here on this earth.

Mysteries: I Googled "Mysteries of Science," and I found "10 Unsolved

Mysteries of Science." Here are some of them. Why do we sleep? How does gravity work? How did life begin? [Actually, for Bible-believing Christians, this last one is not a mystery at all.] Also, how do plate tectonics work, and how do animals migrate?

There is another mystery that science and the world have not solved. Thanks be to God! God has "made known to us the mystery of His will according to His good pleasure, which He purposed in Christ." There will always be mysteries that science can never hope to explain, but the mystery of our forgiveness and salvation by Jesus Christ has been fully revealed.

Thank You, Father, for You have revealed to us the mystery of Your love through Your Son Jesus. Bless your people with opportunities to share this mystery with others. We pray in His holy name. Amen.
