### **Weekly Devotion**

Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. He chose to give us birth through the words of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of all He created . . . Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. But the man who looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it—he will be blessed in what he does . . . Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world. (James

The Epistle of James: Martin Luther had some pretty "out there" opinions when it came to the Epistle of James. He made it clear that he did not esteem it as highly as other books of the Bible, especially in the New Testament. Contrary to what some have claimed, he did not demand that the Epistle of James be omitted from the Bible. What he did state was that he did not find it very useful, because he found the Gospel lacking in it. He felt that the focus of this book was too much on good works.

If you take time to read the Epistle of James—it's a short book; it won't take you very long—you will find plenty of St. James' teachings about the role that godly living plays in demonstrating our faith, which is NOT dependent on godly living. However, the author does make reference to "every good and perfect gift which is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights." And he goes on to say, "He chose to give us birth through the words of truth . . . " Did you catch that? God chose us; we didn't choose Him. That's Gospel. His "good and perfect gift [that] is from above" is the truth that Jesus died and rose again for sinners, for you and me. By God's grace—not our own good works—a saving relationship with God is possible.

So, what about good works? They are essential to our Christian lives. "What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save him? Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, 'Go, I wish you well;

keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead." (James 2:14-17) Do you want to see evidence of a saving faith? First, do you confess that Jesus is your Lord and Savior? Do you believe that God raised Him from the dead? If your answer is "Yes," then look at your faith as measured by good works. Do your good works give evidence of your saving faith? And for all who support Orphan Grain Train with prayers, encouragement, service, and gifts, we especially hold fast to what St. James writes: "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress . . . "

Heavenly Father, bless us with lives that give testimony to the love of God living in us. Bless the work of Orphan Grain Train, that we may strive to look after orphans and widows in their distress, and to provide help for all who are hungry and suffering. We pray in Jesus' name.
