
Husker Sew and Vac's owner Brian in

OGT Iowa West Volunteers Load Aid for Ukraine













OGT-New England to Peru








Volunteers at Orphan Grain Train New England loaded a 40' container of needed items for Peru last month. The shipment was sent to ODP

OGT is now sponsoring an Adopt-an-Orphanage ministry in Ukraine, working together with Alla Vasylieva and Bible Orphan Ministry. So far, we have received support for eight institutions, and more opportunities may be coming our way. Alla included this testimony from 16-yr-old Artem, who attended a summer camp sponsored by Bible Orphan Ministry and funded by OGT.

I love the Lord, for He heard my voice; He heard my cry for mercy.


Because He turned His ear to me, I will call on Him as long as I live . . . Be at rest once more, O my soul, for the Lord has been good to you. For You, O Lord, have delivered my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet

from stumbling, that I may walk before the Lord in the land of the living. (Ps. 116:1-2, 7-9) The Sovereign Lord has given me an instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary. He wakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen like one being taught . . . Let him who walks in the dark, who has no light, trust in the name of the Lord and rely on his God. (Is. 50:4, 10b)
