## Trio Collects and Delivers to Pine Ridge in Wanblee, S.D.





Every Thursday, long-time Orphan Grain Train Norfolk volunteer Jane Ternus, works at the Servant Center. She also gathers items that are set aside for the Families Working Together organization in Wanblee, S.D. Jane transports the items to storage until Jeff and Dee Acklie of Omaha can pick them up and take them to the Pine Ridge location. In November, the Acklies of Omaha, picked up 80 boxes of items to be delivered to Families Working Together. Families Working Together is a nonprofit organization established to support and strengthen families on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Items that were delivered included bedding, hygiene products, diapers, household goods, winter coats, boots and accessories. Peanut butter, fruit roll ups and baby food were also part of the load.

In October, Jane delivered 43 Christmas boxes to the organization. Along with receiving the carefully packed Christmas boxes, children also learn about the coming of Jesus into our world. The Christmas story is included in every box.

Orphan Grain Train Norfolk volunteers loaded for the Philippines today. The Philippine Islands has been hit by three major disasters in the last few months. Two powerful typhoons and a Magnitude 6.5 earthquake in Cebu impacted many people living in the region. Many of the items in this container were requested by the recipients following the devastation of those natural disasters. Disaster items include sleeping mats, buckets, cots, tarps and tarp kits, plastic totes, solar lights, hygiene kits and supplies and survival kits. Thank you, OGT Wichita donors and volunteers for sharing, preparing and loading this container to Lithuania.



#### Thank you Knotty Ladies!




These are the Knotty Ladies from Immanuel

#### **OGT Lincoln Delivers Aid**




Orphan Grain Train Lincoln distributed items to 17 different locations in Lincoln and Omaha this past November. Hygiene supplies, medical equipment, clothing, Mercy Meals, bedding and linens, sports equipment, over 100 lbs. of dry food, and bicycles were delivered to organizations that have recipients that will put these items to use. Sometimes a drop off is a box of eyeglasses or several boxes of clothing, hygiene supplies and household supplies. Another time, it is a delivery of 12 bicycles to the Lincoln Bike Kitchen. ## **Weekly Devotion**

Then they came to Jericho. As Jesus and His disciples, together with a large crowd, were leaving the city, a blind man, Bartimaeus (that is, Son of Timaeus), was sitting by the roadside begging. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Many rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called to the

blind man, "Cheer up! On your feet! He's calling you."

Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to
Jesus. "What do you want Me to do for you?" Jesus asked
him. The blind man said, "Rabbi, I want to see." "Go," said
Jesus, "your faith has healed you." Immediately he received
his sight and followed Jesus along the road. (Mark 10:46-52)

Blind Bartimaeus: We don't know much about Bartimaeus. Here's what we do know. He was a blind beggar, the "son of Timaeus." He became aware that Jesus was on the road where he sat begging. He became excited and began "to shout, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Even though many told him to shut up, he continued to shout. And "Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him." I'm just speculating, but maybe St. Mark identifies Bartimaeus and his father by name, because some of those reading his Gospel personally knew of them.

Bartimaeus heeded Jesus' call and came to Him. And when Jesus asked, "What do you want me to do for you," Bartimaeus had a simple but straightforward request. "Rabbi, I want to see." Well, maybe it wasn't that simple. Bartimaeus wasn't just visually impaired. He was totally blind. He had probably been BORN blind. He was asking Jesus to do the impossible.

And Jesus does the impossible! "'Go,' said Jesus, 'your faith has

healed you.' Immediately he received his sight . . . " Jesus had mercy on this blind beggar. And Jesus has had mercy on us, too. We, too, suffer from blindness, but it is spiritual blindness. Left on our own, we cannot see Jesus. Without Jesus reaching out to us, there is no cure for this blindness. Jesus heals us of our spiritual blindness by His gifts of faith, forgiveness, and salvation. We once were blind, but now we see . . . We see Jesus!

Open our eyes, Lord. We want to see You! Amen.
