Aid to Jamaica Continues















Orphan Grain Train's cargo arrived safely in Kingston, Jamaica on November 21, 2025 and its distribution began very quickly. Mustard Seed Communities received two pallets of Mercy Meals and also provided the transport of another pallet to Operation Save Jamaica. Operation Save Jamaica received roof patch kits as well. The remaining food and kits were loaded onto a truck to be delivered to Maggotty where high flood waters from Hurricane Melissa isolated the community. We are thankful for the Mustard Seeds help in transporting these items through the night.

The water filtration system that was moved to Santa Cruz, Jamaica continues to change the stream water into clean drinking water for people in the area. Andre and Andrew are maintaining the machine and helping to distribute the potable water. The town of Santa Cruz is still waiting for their water pipes to be repaired after the destruction of Hurricane Melissa. Orphan Grain Train will continue to support disaster relief in Jamaica and are in daily communication with our recipients there.

Weekly Devotion

Yet it was the Lord's will to crush Him and cause Him to suffer, and though the Lord makes His life a guilt offering, He will see His offspring and prolong His days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in His hand. After the suffering of His soul, He will see the light of life, and be satisfied; by His knowledge My righteous servant will justify many, and He will bear their iniquities. Therefore I will give Him a portion among the great, and He will divide the spoils with the strong, because He poured out His life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors. (Is. 53:10-12)

The Suffering Servant: Bible scholars have called Isaiah 53 the chapter about the Suffering Servant. The Old Testament prophet Isaiah, inspired by the Holy Spirit,

writes of the suffering of Jesus Christ—already 700 years before the Savior's life and death. His words are prescient. He says that "it was the Lord's will to crush Him and cause Him to suffer." Jesus was crushed by the weight of our sins, and He suffered unimaginably on the cross. Jesus "poured out His life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors." Jesus, the sinless Son of God, died on that cross. He was crucified by sinners and between two sinners—two thieves.

But Isaiah also prophecies about the atoning works of Christ. "The Lord (made) His life a guilt offering." "My righteous servant will justify many, and He will bear their iniquities . . . He bore the sin of many." Isaiah also prophesies about Jesus' resurrection: "After the suffering of His soul, He will see the light of life."

Jesus became the servant of all. He took all our sufferings upon Himself. That is remarkable, given that the Holy Son of God did the unthinkable for the unholy, and that includes you and me! What does He require of His people? St. Mark writes, "Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:43b-45)

Holy Jesus, You have shown us what it means to be a servant. Bless us that we may serve You as we serve others. Amen.
