**As rain is making grass grow again in some areas, Orphan Grain Train is assisting in the replacement of fences after the western Nebraska fires that ignited and burned in mid-March of 2026. Volunteers drove to Farnam, Nebraska on May 4, 2026 as a fencing reconnaissance crew. De Wayne Erickson, Walt Rosenbaum, Nick Weber and Ross Nelson trailered a**

side-by-side, skid steer loader, hydraulic post auger, hydraulic post pounder, skid steer bucket and forklift forks. So far, they have taken out and put in almost three-quarter mile of fencing through the straight-a-ways and the ravines. They are hoping to return to the area soon. Thank you, Farnam Community Center ladies for providing a warm and delicious noon meal to DeWayne, Ross, Walt and Nick during their time there this past week. Thank you to this crew for agreeing to lead on this mission and to all the donors who have supported the delivery of hay, fencing supplies and the aid to western Nebraska.

Many beautiful and unique quilts are shared with Orphan Grain Train, but not their story. Quilts are sewn into the history of Orphan Grain Train. Quilts were included on the first shipments to Latvia and Russia in 1993, and were given to children in orphanages.

**Orphan Grain Train accepts quilts and blankets in all sizes, year-round.**

All 27 Orphan Grain Train branches and collection centers receive donated quilts which

are shipped by OGT to people in need both domestically and internationally.

## Weekly Devotion



A new command I give you:  
Love one another.  
As I have loved you,  
so you must love one another.

John 13:34-35

**A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you love one another. (John 13: 34-35)**

**The Stakes Are Raised: Almost everyone is probably aware of the Golden Rule. It dates back to the Old Testament. The Lord, speaking through Moses, says, “. . . love your neighbor as yourself.” (Lev. 19:18b) Jesus quoted this as the second greatest commandment in Mark 12:31.**

**That’s why the disciples may have been perplexed when, in the Upper Room on the night when He was betrayed, Jesus said, “A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.” You mean it’s not enough to love our neighbor as we love ourselves? We have to love our neighbor as Jesus has loved us? And how did Jesus prove His love? Why, He laid down His life for us! Loving our neighbor as ourselves, loving others, can be a selfish kind of love. We may love others because we seek something in return. Jesus calls for a selfless, sacrificial kind of love, and He is the role model for such love. He loved us**

enough to die for all sinners, for all who our undeserving of His love. “If (we) love one another,” as Jesus loves us, we give testimony to others that we are driven by God’s love and not by our own selfish purposes.

**Lord Jesus, teach us to love others as You love us. Amen.**
